In partnership with the Indigenous Leadership Institute (ILDI) and Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC), SFNEDN would like announce the new option now available to First Nation economic development officers or elected officials who work within economic development.

In an effort to ensure that Saskatchewan First Nation communities have an equal opportunity to participate in WIBF 2016 and to help alleviate cost to the community, one (1) registration fee will be paid for one delegate from each First Nation band, to an individual who is responsible for economic development, an officer or portfolio councilor working with economic development. 

The Court acknowledged the challenges associated with the approval process for Northern Gateway were immense and that the Crown should not be held to a standard of perfection in

discharging its duty to consult. Nevertheless, a majority of the panel found that an important phase of the Aboriginal consultation process "fell well short of the mark".
